With larger than life exhibits and attractions, the Kennedy Space Center Visitor Complex brings you face-to-face with the past. present and future of space exploration. Tour launch areas, watch mind-blowing IMAX films, experience spaceflight simulators, view rocket launches and even shake hands with a veteran astronaut.


Bus tours of the Space Center and Air Force Station offer an in-depth and up-closeand-personal view of the space program.

At the Visitor Complex, there are IMAX movies, live theatrical productions and the chance to meet a real space traveler during the Astronaut Encounter or Lunch with an Astronaut.

The new Shuttle Launch Experience gives visitors a first-hand familiarity with the stomach-clenching excitement that astronauts feel as the shuttle lifts them off the Earth and into the stars.







# Air Force Space & Missile Museum

Unearthing the HISTORY of space exploration





Every story has a beginning. For America's missile and space exploration programs,

the tale is strongly rooted at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station, where during the past 60 years the United States has launched more than 3,500 rockets on missions as varied as testing warhead nosecones to voyaging throughout the solar system.

To showcase the story of the many launch pads that heve contributed to our national security, science books and spirit of exploration, the Air Force Space & Missile Museum recently opened a new Space & Missile History Center outside the security gates of Cape Canaveral Air Force Station.

This new history center chronicles the story of each launch complex used at the air station, from its establishment in 1950 to the present day. Among the larger artifacts on display are Titan and Atlas rocket engines, as well as nosecones from Jupiter and Pershing missiles.
