The Avenue Viera

This 415,000-square-foot open-air shopping venue offers more than 70 stores, including Belk, Bed Bath & Beyond and Old Navy. Enjoy dining in one of 10 restaurants including the Melting Pot, Pizza Gallery and new addition Five Guys, or watch a movie at the Rave 16-screen stadium theater.

Viera MarketPlace

Located just south of The Avenue Viera Shops include Kohl's, Sports Authority, Petland, Office Depot and specialty stores.

Shoppes of Lake Andrew

Located south of the Avenue Viera Shops include Ross, Hobby Lobby, Pier 1 Imports and Petco.

Melbourne Square Mall

Featuring 15 specialty retailers, Melbourne Square Mall is anchored by department store favorites including Macy's, Dillard's (North and South) and JC Penney. Recent additions include Coach and Dick's Sporting Goods. The mall also has a custom-designed 1,500-square-foot children's play area, Simon Kidget's Korner.

Searstown Mall

This Titusville mall is anchored by Sears and also features Bealls Outlet, Fred's Department Store, Prize Possessions Toy Store, Cindy's Hallmark, Raintree Arts & Crafts, Valentino's New York Style Pizza & Restaurant, Marianna's Latin Café and several specialty shops. The mall also has Titusville's only movie theater, United Artists Searstown 10.

The nostalgic area offers arts and crafts shops, clothing and consignment shops, flower and gift shops, as well as a number of restaurants. A few blocks south of the downtown area on U.S. 1 there are specialty stores, including antique shops.

Crossroads Marketplace

On State Road 405, just south of State Road 50, Crossroads Marketplace is Titusville's newest retail development. Consisting of more than 200,000 square feet of retail space, the marketplace is anchored by Target. Other stores include Kay Jewelers, Marshalls, Petco and Merla Norman.

Cottage Row

In the downtown area of Cocoa Beach, just north of the Minutemen Causeway and between Orlando and Atlantic Avenues. lies Cottage Row — military houses from the 1940s and '50s that have been converted into quaint shops, salons and restaurants.

Cocoa Village

This historic spot of downtown Cocoa is tree-lined and brick-paved with several independent venues specializing in gift items, arts and crafts, galleries, gournet foods, metaphysical books, antiques and clothing. The Village is home to casual and upscale restaurants and bars featuring music. It is also the scene of popular arts and crafts shows. The area features an amphitheater, fishing on the Indian River, a kid's fountain, historic homes, churches, walking tours, and the headquarters for the Florida Historical Society.

Downtown Eau Gallie

On the riverfront east of U.S. Highway 1, downtown Eau Gallie runs north of the Eau Gallie Causeway to south of Parkway Drivo. The area is home to art galleries, bookstores, salons, antique shops, a bakery and restaurants. A farmer's market is held in the area each weekend.

Fifth Avenue

This beachside extension of U.S. Highway 192 in Indialantic is lined with a collection of restaurants and specialty shops. The area includes a Starbucks coffee shop and a Cold Stone Creamery ice cream store.

Hammock Landing

Located west of the intersection of 1-95 and Palm Bay Road HammockLandingFL.com

Enjoy shopping or dining at Hammock Landing's outstanding collection of retailers and restaurants. Anchors include Kohl's, Marshalls, Michaels, hhgregg and Petco.
